## 8-DAY ITENERARY



### DAY 1: MEDINA & ZITOUNA MOSQUE

Upon arrival drivers will meet you at the airport and take you to check into the hotel. **Go to Tunis Medina and see Zitouna Mosque.**

The Medina was designated as an UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1979. The winding streets are full of artisan shops selling jewelry, leather goods, rugs, and many other cultural souvenirs.

The Zitouna Mosque is the oldest mosque in Tunis and one of the most influential in North Africa.



### DAY 2: CARTHAGE, SIDI BOU SAID, & BARDO MUSEUM

**Enjoy a tour of the ancient historical site of Carthage.** The site is home to artifacts and ruins spanning from Carthaginian, Roman, Vandal, and Byzantine empires.

Continuing the day, you will take a short drive to **the iconic village of Sidi Bou Said**, nestled on a hill overlooking the Mediterranean Sea.

From Sidi Bou Said, you will visit **the Bardo Museum**. The museum is home to the largest collection of mosaics in the world. The collection of artifacts range from the Carthaginian to Islamic Empires.



### DAY 3: DOUGGA, BULLA REGIA, & EL KEF

Enjoy a beautiful drive to **Dougga Roman Archaeological Site**. Dougga is one of the best-preserved and largest Roman historical sites in Tunisia.

After Dougga you will travel to and tour one of the most unique archaeological sites in Tunisia, **Bulla Regia**. Here you will see well-preserved underground Roman villas. It is believed that St. Augustine of Hippo made a stop to Bulla Regia on his travels between Hippo and Carthage. Then stay the night in a guest house in El Kef.

**DAY 4: MAKTHAR,  
SBEITLA, & KAIROUAN**

Travel to **Makthar**. While there, be on the lookout for the large Romans baths, forum, and basilicas. There is a museum on-site with a collection of artifacts.

Then tour **Sbeitla**, a vast and well-preserved site with wonders such as ancient churches with well-designed baptisteries, temples, baths, mosaics, and the Arch of Diocletian.

Finally, travel to **the important Islamic city of Kairouan**, where you will eat dinner and check into the hotel.

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**DAY 5: KAIROUAN, EL  
DJEM, & MONASTIR**

Tour the great mosque in **Kairouan**, one of the oldest and historically significant mosques in North Africa. Afterwards, take a walk through the medina. Indiana Jones fans may recognize some of the streets of Kairouan.

Travel to **El Jem** and see the great colosseum, one of the best-preserved and largest coliseums across the Roman Empire. Next enjoy the drive along the Mediterranean through the coastal cities of **Mahdia** and **Monastir**. Monastir is the birthplace of Habib Bourguiba, Tunisia's independence leader and first president. If time permits, you can see the important sites from Bourguiba's life.

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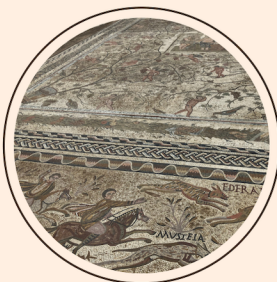


**DAY 6: SOUSSE**

Take the afternoon to either shop in the Sousse medina, one of Tunisia's eight UNESCO sites, or relax and swim at your beach resort.

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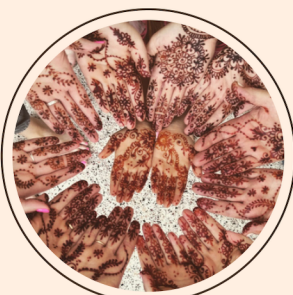


**DAY 7: ZAGHOUAN &  
OUDHNA**

Travel to **Zaghouan** and see the Roman water temple. Zaghouan was the water source and the start of the aqueducts going to Carthage.

That afternoon, go to **Oudhna Archaeological Site**. Some highlights of the site are an amphitheater, forum, Roman baths, and ancient homes.
